REPORT OF OFFICERS: PRESIDENT:

Thanks go to Gerard Grysko, our newest Trustee, for adding over 40 new members to our Sub-Chapter through a membership drive of the Wayne County Sheriffs and Airport Police Retiree Association.

Absentee ballots are out and we encourage you to complete them and turn them in. Although you can mail them, we would encourage you to return them to your city/township clerk's office to make sure they get in, especially as we get closer to Election Day, Tuesday, November 5th.

We are still working with Zoom on testing a Zoom Meeting System. The hardware company said they do not normally rent equipment to test, but will work with Zoom to make it happen.

The Retiree Trustee Election will be held between Bettye Misuraca, the current incumbent, and Tina Turner. They both spoke at our last meeting. The election will be held by mail in balloting and will be conducted in November.

The active Employee Trustee, Cassandra MacDonald (no relation to Hugh) has retired and only one person filed for the position. Dennis Martin will be the new Active Employee Trustee serving a 4-year term beginning January 1, 2025.

There will be an election at today's meeting for a Trustee with term ending September 30, 2027.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Sister Bauman, to accept the President's report as presented. The motion carried.

VICE-PRESIDENT: The Wayne County Employees' Labor Coalition's October 23 meeting was cancelled.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Sister Bauman, to accept the Vice-President's report. The motion carried.

SECRETARY-TREASURER:

Financial Report:

Brother Noelke reported that the Sub-Chapter has \$259,238.45 in cash and investments as of September 30, 2024. There are 1,217 members with a loss of 52 members since the first of the year. Currently there are 171 members with payroll deductions to the AFSCME PEOPLE fund.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Sister Bauman, to accept the Treasurer report as of September 30, 2024, as presented. The motion carried.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Sister O'Leary-MacGillis, to adjust the 2023-24 Budget by moving \$4000 of Investment Income to over the shortages in Conferences and Conventions; Office Supplies; and Postage. The motion carried.

Motion by Brother Macdonald, properly supported by Brother Pendracki, to accept the 2024-25 Sub-Chapter 38 budget as recommended with \$37,700 anticipated revenue and disbursements of \$19,994. The motion carried.

PEOPLE:

The endorsements made by Chapter 255 were in your meeting announcements for today's meeting and are also on the Chapter 255 website. Make a plan to vote and make sure to vote the **non-partisan section** of the ballot.

Motion by Brother Macdonald, properly supported by Brother Pendracki, to accept the PEOPLE Committee report as given. The motion carried.

Trustee Report:

Trustee Hyde-Shelton, read the September 25, 2024, Trustee Semi-Annual Audit to the Executive Board.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Sister Bauman, to accept the Trustees' Semi-Annual report as presented. The motion carried.

REPORT, COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS: (Presented by Brother Macdonald) Medical Insurance for Disability Retirees

Since 2020, AFSCME Council 25 and this Sub-Chapter have been challenging the Wayne County discontinuance of health care insurance for disability retirees. There have been three (3) arbitration hearings, numerous Wayne County Circuit Court decisions and two (2) Michigan Court of Appeals hearings. Notwithstanding that, the arbitrator and the courts ruled against Wayne County each time, Wayne County, once again, has filed another appeal to the Michigan Supreme Court. Wayne County continues to appeal the first arbitrator's award that states, "The County violated the collective bargaining agreement when it made changes to healthcare benefits for newly approved duty and non-duty disability retirees. The County must rescind Administrative Personnel Order 1-2010 and make whole the duty or non-duty disability retirees who were improperly denied healthcare benefits after 2010 by virtue of the fact that they did not meet the age and service requirements for "normal" retirement."

As of now, Council 25 and this Sub-Chapter are waiting on the latest arbitrator's award, and if the Michigan Supreme Court will accept the latest Wayne County appeal.

HEALTH CARE INSURANCE SETTLEMENT (STIPENDS)

The payments by Wayne County of non-Medicare eligible stipends appear to be consistent with the settlement agreement through the payment due October 1, 2024. Wayne County is providing monthly reports of stipend amounts transferred to MERS/Alerus.

The Sub-Chapter has one (1) open file with unique questions concerning retiree stipends. This file is expected to be resolved without a grievance being filed.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Brother Wadlin, to accept Brother Macdonald's report. The motion carried.
