REPORT OF OFFICERS:

President:

Just a reminder that the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. dinner is Saturday, February 22, 2025. It will be held at the International Banquet Center, 400 Monroe St., 8th Flor. Cocktail time will begin at 6:00 pm with dinner to follow at 7:00 pm. The following members have been provided a ticket to the dinner: Nicole Parone; Elona Davis, Betty Bishop, Kim Curry-Smith, Tom O'Brien, Kyle Orr, Larry Jessup, Elaine Gilbert, Keisha Clark and her son. Parking will be reimbursed for \$20 with a paid receipt.

If you have a 40A and/or a 457 account with Empower, they are encouraging everyone to register their account and put in a beneficiary. There are 1,079 401A accounts and 1,069 457 accounts not registered. Failure to register your account leaves your account vulnerable to hacking and would allow someone else to register the account in their name. There are also 1,756 401A accounts without a beneficiary. And 1,007 457 accounts with a beneficiary. If you want the balances in your accounts to be paid to the appropriate person, you need to make sure you have named a beneficiary. You will need the social security number of your beneficiary to complete the update. If you have both types of accounts, you will need to register each account separately and add beneficiary information separately to each account.

The newly created "Benefits Committee" met and discussed the possibility of having the Inflation Equity Check restored. Brother Tom Koenig and Brother Tom Komrey attended the meeting, and it was explained that this would not be something that will be achieved in the short run as both the County Commissioners and the County Executive would have to be supportive of this type of change. The committee will meet again to discuss options for a starting point to discuss with the County. I am gathering information from other retirement systems regarding any cost-of-living adjustments that they may provide. I don't want to get your hopes up that this is a done deal as we have a long way to go to bring this to fruition. If you want to sit on this committee, please provide me with your name, e-mail address and cell phone number. Once I have more information, we will schedule another meeting.

Finally, I would request authorization to be reimbursed for any costs for meals, meeting expenses or incidental expenses I might incur in meeting with the Benefits Committee, Commissioners, County Executive staff or others.

SECRETARY-TREASURER:

Financial Report:

Brother Noelke reported that the Sub-Chapter has \$250,848.05 in cash and investments as of January 31, 2025. There are 1,204 members with a loss of 10 members since the first of the year. Currently there are 173 members with payroll deductions to the AFSCME PEOPLE fund.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Sister Bauman, to accept the Treasurer report for February 2025 as presented. The motion carried.

Brother Noelke submitted three reports for consideration; the 2024 Federal income tax return, the AFSCME annual financial report; and the surety bond report.

Medical Insurance for Disability Retirees

The Michigan Supreme has not issued a response to the latest Wayne County November 7, 2024, application for appeal. The arbitrator has indicated she will issue an award from June 13, 2024, arbitration hearing.

HEALTH CARE INSURANCE SETTLEMENT (STIPENDS) Prescription Co-Pay Settlement

The remittances by Wayne County for non-Medicare eligible and the deposits of Medicare eligible stipends into member's accounts at ALERUS continue to be consistent with the settlement agreement through February 1, 2025. Wayne County is providing monthly reports of stipend payments. Wayne County has also agreed to provide account status reports of the accounts at ALERUS as requested by the Sub-Chapter. The Sub-Chapter has one (1) open file with unique questions concerning retiree stipends. This file is expected to be resolved without grievance being filed.

Motion by Brother Pendracki, properly supported by Sister Bauman, to accept Brother Macdonald's report. The motion carried.
